IV. INTRODUCTORY REMARKS BY THE VICE-CHANCELLOR

Honourable Members of the Academic Council

It gives me immense pleasure to welcome you all, once again, to the Ordinary Meeting of the Academic Council being held today. Also, I welcome the new Members of this August Body and request them to offer their constructive ideas for the new approaches in the curricula and other complimentary suggestions to this August Body.

It is my great pride and privilege to share with you all that the 158th Annual Convocation is to be held on Monday, the 28th September 2015 at 11.30 a.m. in the University Centenary Auditorium. I am very glad to state that Thiru. Gopalkrishna Gandhi, Former Governor of West Bengal & a Distinguished Professor of History and Politics, Ashoka University has consented to be the Chief Guest and deliver the Convocation Address. I invite all the members to attend the Convocation and grace the occasion.

I would like to recall certain statements made by me while addressing the Academic Council Meeting in February 2013 after assuming the office of the Vice Chancellor of this great Mother University of South India, that is,

“This University is near and dear to my heart. I have spent and am spending a major part of my life in this University. Thanks to my long association with this University, I have a dream of this University; I have a vision of this University; I have a plan for this University” and wherein I shared my views, that “I would develop five peaks of Excellence” viz. Research and Innovation; Higher Learning; Infrastructure; Social Responsibility and Administration.

As soon as I assumed the office of the Vice-Chancellor, three main tasks namely, Conduct of Three Convocations, Appointment of Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff, CAS Promotion and NAAC Re-Accreditation were pending before me and I have taken effective measures to achieve the feat for the welfare of student community, strengthening of teaching fraternity and administration within a short period of time.

Most Revered Amma and Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamilnadu had delivered the Convocation Address during the 155th Annual Convocation, two Supplemental Convocations 2011 and 2012 held on 17th August 2013. Hon’ble the then Chief Justice, Supreme Court of India, Thiru P.Sathasivam was the Chief Guest and delivered the 156th Annual Convocation Address held on 19th December 2013 and the 157th Annual Convocation Address was delivered by the Chief Guest,



Dr.H.Devaraj, Vice-Chairman, University Grants Commission, New Delhi. Apart from this, Supplemental Convocations of 2013, 2014 and 2015 were conducted. Totally nine convocations have been conducted.

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council, [NAAC] Bangalore has awarded "A" Grade with the highest Cumulative Grade Point Average [CGPA] of 3.32 in four point scale which leads University of Madras to be top among the State Universities of Tamil Nadu.

Appointments of the Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Dean, College Development Council, Director for UGC Human Resource Development Centre and University Students Advisory Bureau have been made.

To strengthen the research activities in the University, 108 Assistant Professors, one Associate Professor and 19 Professors in various University Departments and Principals for University Constituent Arts and Science Colleges, Nemmeli and Thiruvottiyur have been appointed.

CAS Promotions have been awarded to 130 Faculty Members of whom 20 were elevated from Stage 1 to 2, 41 members from Stage 2 to 3, 45 members from Stage 3 to 4 and 24 members from Stage 4 to 5.

A total of 73 Administrative Staff, which include 48 Class III (Assistant) and 13 Class IV (Office Assistant, Attender, Animal House Attender and Driver) 13 Technical Staff (viz. Library Assistant 11 and Technical Officer 01) have been appointed.

Two fulltime qualified Student Counsellors have been appointed towards the welfare of the student community.

Health Centre has been established with two full time Doctors and Staff Nurses for the welfare of the staff and students of the University. Also, Yoga and Fitness Centre have been established for the benefit of the students community.



The following new Departments/Centers have been created for the improvement of Research and Academic activities.

- i. Department of Network Systems and Information Technology
- ii. Department of Bio-Informatics
- iii. Department of Material Science
- iv. Department of Social Work
- v. Department of Women Studies
- vi. Sangapalagai for Tamil Development
- vii. Madras University Centre for Advanced Research Development.
- viii. National Centre for Neurotoxicity Research to Assist Drug Development
- ix. Centre of Research on Prisons and Rehabilitation of Prisons.

Following Departments /Centres have been activated by appointing Heads:

- i. Centre for Natural Hazards and Disaster Studies
- ii. Centre for Ocean & Costal Studies
- iii. Centre for Environmental Sciences
- iv. Centre for Population Studies
- v. Centre for Herbal Science
- vi. Centre for Infrastructural Management Studies

Also, action is being initiated to establish the following Centres/Departments to augment the Research activities of the University.

- i. Centre for Endangered Languages
- ii. Centre for Stem Cell Research
- iii. Centre for Water Resources Management
- iv. Centre for Counseling Psychology

An Advertisement is being given to fill up various teaching posts and in University Constituent Arts and Science Colleges and Assistant Professors and Professors in the IDE.

Advertisement is also given for filling up of Librarian, Deputy Librarian and Assistant Librarian in the University and Constituent Colleges.

In addition to that, all the newly recruited Assistant Professors, a sum of Rs.2.00 Lakhs for each have been sanctioned as Starter Grant to enrich the research in their field of specialization.

In achieving the Excellence in Higher Learning the following activities have taken place:

To achieve innovation and to bring it to up to date, the syllabi have been revised by the concerned Board of Studies for UG, PG and M.Phil Courses offered in the Affiliated Colleges of the University and the PG and M.Phil Courses offered in the University Departments for subjects, Economics, Performing Arts, Philosophy, Zoology, Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, Computer Science, Chemistry, Mathematics, Home Science, Electronics and Communication, Microbiology, Statistics, Chemistry, Plant Biology and Bio Technology, Statistics, Commerce, English, Social Work, Botany and Bio Informatics. Nearly, thirty Boards of Studies have been reconstituted and Nomenclature of various UG and PG courses have been changed as recommended by the UGC.

M.Tech (Two-Years) Nano Science and Nano Technology has been instituted from the Academic Year 2015-2016 and is being offered at the National Centre for Nano Science and Nano Technology.

The Soft Skill Programme since 2013 - 2014, has been conducted by the faculty of University of Madras without being outsourced. The Syllabus for Soft Skill Programmes for University Department students have been revised to compete in the competitive examinations and to ensure employability.

To promote better understanding between the faculty and students from other Institutions in advancement of academic and research activities, there are 18 Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) signed /renewed with other Institutions in India and Abroad, viz., Korea, Thailand, Chile, U.K., Italy, France, Japan, Latvia, Spain, etc.

Foreign students numbering about 30 have been admitted in various PG courses of Humanities in various Departments of the University through International Centre for University of Madras (ICOM).

In achieving Excellence in Infrastructure, the construction of Student Amenity Centre at Chepuak, Microbiology Building, Post-Graduate and Research Scholar Hostel, International Students Hostel at Taramani and Animal House at Guindy Campuses have been completed and departments / students have started using these facilities.

The construction of Multistoried Building at Taramani and Guindy campuses, Insectarium Building and Nano Technology Building at Guindy Campus and Guest House for UGC Human Resource Development Centre at ORI Campus are nearing completion. Totally 6.5 lakhs sq.ft of space has been added during this period.

I am happy to inform you that under University with the Potential for Excellence Programme - Phase II have been allocated a sanctioned a sum of Rs.533 lakhs for New Buildings, Rs. 100 lakhs for furnishing the new buildings, Rs. 100 lakhs for Computer Net Working and Rs. 100 lakhs for modernizing the Library. All the funds have been utilized for this purpose efficiently.

Under the University Potential for Excellence Programme[UPE] - Phase-II, 55 Research Projects with 91 faculty members of the University to the tune of RS. 740.52 lakhs have been approved and sanctioned.

The Department of Science and Technology [DST], Government of India has sanctioned a sum of Rs.31.40 crores under 'PURSE' to our University and a sum of Rs. 5 crores has been released. Out of which 53 Research Fellowships have been created and awarded to 29 Science Departments.

Also, the Department of Bio-Technology, Government of India, has sanctioned a sum of Rs.5.018 crores for the project entitled "DBT - University of Madras Interdisciplinary Life Sciences Programme for Advanced Research and Education" under BUILDER (University Interdisciplinary Life Science Departments for Education and Research) Programme.

Further, the elective papers to be offered under this project in M.Sc Degrees in Zoology(Special), M.Sc Botany, M.Sc Advanced Biochemistry and M.Sc Biotechnology under CBCS pattern at the University Departments have been approved by the Syndicate.

The UGC has released around Rs.8 crores to the University for the various Departments under the XII Plan.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has approved the proposal to install the solar power plant at the various campuses of our University.

To sustain the Social Responsibility, the University has made many contributions. In such a way that,

Under the Free Education Scheme in the past three academic years nearly 475 poor students have been admitted in the UG courses at the affiliated colleges of our University.

The Foreign Language Laboratory has been established in the University to provide training in teaching courses such as spoken and presentation skills, essential communication skills and foreign languages like English, French, German and Chinese under the Government of Tamil Nadu grant of Rs.15 lakhs. In this, preference is given to first generation students from affiliated colleges.

As announced by the Government of Tamil Nadu scheme "Study Abroad Programme" for providing opportunity to experience an International exposure with the greater understanding of multiple perspectives of international issues, PG students of affiliated colleges have been permitted to study at the foreign universities and the credits earned by them have been taken into account while awarding the degree.

Autonomous status has been conferred to Guru Nanak College, Chennai and Sri Sankara Arts and Science College, Kancheepuram for a period of six years with effect from the academic year 2015-2016 to 2020-2021. Also autonomous status has been extended to Ethiraj College for Women, Chennai.

The fresh affiliations have been granted to Government Arts and Science College, Uthiramerur and St. Anne's Arts and Science College, Madhavaram, Chennai.

Continuation of Affiliation for the UG/PG/PG Dip/Certificate Courses have been granted to various affiliated colleges and as many as 200 courses for the past three academic years.

The Students Safety Insurance Scheme has been implemented for the benefit of students of the University of Madras and Affiliated Colleges covering more than 1.5 lakh students.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has sanctioned an one time grant of Rs. 1.02 crore for the establishment of Research on Prison and Rehabilitation of Prison. Under this scheme, four Research Assistants have been selected and appointed.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has short listed our University for the institution of 3 Centres of Excellence (CoE) under Tamil Nadu Vision Plan 2023 through Tamil Nadu Infrastructure Development Board and they are

1. Centre of Excellence in Basic Sciences
2. Centre of Excellence in Nano Science and Nanotechnology
3. Centre of Excellence in Humanities and Social Sciences.

The introduction of Online payment of Examination fees is presently getting huge attraction from the student community and the above system is working well and also ECS payment of Examination fee by the Colleges. Bulk payment is has also been introduced and this system is also working well. A meeting of Principals of Colleges will be convened shortly to get their views regarding further reforms to be implemented in the University examinations.

I place on record my sincere thanks for the support extended by the Principals and teachers of all the Affiliated Colleges for the speedy publication of results of various examinations conducted by the University in April 2015 well in advance. Likewise, the Institute of Distance Education May 2015 examination will also be published well in advance.

Now the challenges before us in the years to come, UNIVERSITY OF EXCELLENCE, Development of New Research Centres which has received start up research funding through UPE II programme viz., Center for Studies in Comparative Religions, Centre for Rural Development and Strategic Studies, Centre for Terrorism, Internal Security and Victims of Crimes, Centre for Cognitive and Behavioural Research, Psycho and Music Therapy Project, Laboratory for Traditional Testing and Standardisation and Multilingual Dictionary Project, Crystallography and Drug Design, Communication and Architecture, Technical Writing, Device Technology, Bioinformatics and Drug Design.

Personally, I am very optimistic about the future of this University. Our faculty, staff and students are incredibly talented, resourceful and deeply committed towards Excellence of University of Madras.

The leadership within the Schools and Departments exemplifies the pioneering spirit that has served us so well. And our alumnae are a potential resource.

I am confident that we will meet the challenges and ensure the University's continued leadership in teaching and research.

Before concluding my speech, it is my duty to record my sincere thanks to His Excellency Governor-Chancellor, The Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi AMMA and the Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu for all the guidance extended to me in the execution of my duties as Vice Chancellor of this great University.

I would also like to thank the Members of the Senate, the Syndicate, the Academic Council, Faculty Members, Administrative Staff, Management of Colleges and Students of the University for the Unstinting Support given to me to carry out my duties as Vice-Chancellor throughout my tenure.

I take this opportunity to acknowledge, appreciate and record my sincere gratitude to each and every Honourable Member of this body, who in one way or other supported me in my successful completion of three years of service as the Vice-Chancellor of this prestigious and premier University of our Country.

Finally to conclude, I wish to quote,

"All our dreams can come true, if we have the courage to pursue them". – Walt Disney

As I said to you in 2013 Academic Council, I have a dream for this University. With this courage I have faced all these and I succeeded in this. Most of the problems have been solved. In the future also the University of Madras will go ahead with all success. This is the last Academic Council, I am a satisfied man as Vice-Chancellor and my term of Office will

come to an end on 17th January 2016. I have drafted this report with the records made available by the Sections and the support extended by the Departments, Deans and Directors, particularly my Registrar and the COE. This is the sixth Academic Council Meeting. I thought of writing this note this is the last Academic Council. But many of my senior colleagues advised me not to do so. Once again I express my sincere thanks to one and all.

Dr. A. Amudhavalli: Respected Vice-Chancellor and Hon'ble Members of the Academic Council, good morning to every one of you. Listening to your address and reading your speech, it is quite impressive. Of course, in your remarks you have said that you have fulfilled all your dreams and all promises made in the first Academic Council meeting held in February 2013. We appreciate it and I personally thank you for all that. We know you have appointed adequate staff members, Professors and under CAS also. When I go through the advertisement which has recently appeared on that in the Syndicate we have approved teaching positions in the regular departments also. Dr. (Mrs.) Fathima Vasanth: Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Respected Registrar and Members of this august Body, while I was listening to our Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor presenting the Report, it looks like the performance report for the last three years and also like a table speech Sir, listening to you I am little bit sad because you were saying that this may be your last Academic Council. I do not know what is your future plans. However, I wish you all the best in all your endeavours. I take this opportunity to congratulate you on your performance. I must say this entire report includes all your achievements during the last three years. For certain achievement, we congratulate you and also requesting you to follow up further before you leave or if you are going to continue. First the fine peaks of excellence which you have pointed out are Research and Innovation. Once again we congratulate you for your initiative. University departments are doing very well and lot of money is coming. There has been much excellence on their own filed. But I would like to



represent on behalf of affiliated colleges particularly self financing colleges. While autonomous and aided colleges got grants, Self-financing colleges are very often presenting in their forum that self financing colleges are not doing well in the research front. As the mother University and as Vice-Chancellor who is responsible to hand hold self financing colleges they are very much lacking in one major component i.e. research and they are having bad beating on research, area one is training, capacity, building that is needed for the college teachers. Secondly, while you say spend for yourself that may not be correct University can help the self financing colleges with some research grants so that self financing colleges can also do well in the research. You have reported very proudly about NAAC that you have got 'A' Grade point and that you are one of the top among the Universities especially in Tamil Nadu. I also request you to please report about the colleges that have gone for NAAC and that have been done especially those colleges which have got 'A' Grade and superseding the University, grade point those colleges also should included in the performance of colleges here in this forum with regard to the complimentary resolutions moved at the beginning of this meeting. I would say that it should keep the quality and it need not be diluted. Members who are going for Board of Studies meeting, Board of examiners, prestigious awards obtained at the national and international level could be included and it can be moved as complimentary resolution. Colleges which have done well can also be reported we are proud that you have started 9 new departments. As I come from Social Work discipline, I would request the Vice-Chancellor to please pay little attention or to give little more importance to social work discipline. I think there are no students admitted. I am sure that Dr V.D. Swaminatha is putting his best to bring up the Department but I think it needs little more attention. I take this opportunity to congratulate you for the publication of results particularly to the COE. One thing I would like to point out here is that the personal visit of the COE has checked a lot of malpractices and I am sure you could give us a statistics that malpractice has been minimized or has come down. As Chief Superintendent for our Colleges, we had NIL malpractice. I am happy to



share this here. Thirdly, on page 11 you have said about Centres. I am just wondering how you have named the Department as Department of Terrorism. It will not be correct nomenclature. We may have to look at it and why we have termed it like that. I am glad that you are going to convene a meeting of the Principals because if you look at the ground reality, you need to have Principals more often here in the University to take direct feedback. Once again I warmly wish you and congratulate you for all the good work done as Vice-Chancellor of this great University.
