The seven day special camp with 100 NSS volunteers of Patrician College of Arts & Science, led by the Programme officers Mr. Prithivi Rajkumar and Ms. Abinaya Devi, was held in Sevalaya, Kasuva Village and Puliur Village, Pakkam, Thiruvallur district from Wednesday **27th February 2019 to Tuesday 5th March 2019**. The camp was inaugurated by **Dr Ahila Sivasankar**, Dean of Extension Activities, Patrician College of arts and science at 3p.m. On the first day of the camp, the volunteers explored Sevalaya and Puliur villages. The volunteers were divided into ten groups and various tasks were allotted to each group for the rest of six days.

Volunteers started their days with prayer and warm-up which was followed by fieldwork in the Sevalaya campus. On the second day, the volunteers cleaned the vermi-compost pit for the vermin composting process. Then, a workshop on making of paper bag and cloth bag was conducted by our volunteers **Ms Jemima and Ms Surya** for the other volunteers. It was followed by a debate on various social issues in which students actively participated and expressed their views.

On the third day, the volunteers worked for the green canopy formation in the sevalaya campus after which a workshop on juice squash making was conducted for a set of volunteers by Mr. **Manoj**, a nutritionist from the Food and Nutrition Department. Another batch of students visited Puliur village to invite the villagers to the free medical camp which had been organized for them the following day. It was followed by an activity in which volunteers discussed various historical events.

On the fourth day, our NSS in collaboration with **Saviour Medicals Trust and Chennai National Hospital** conducted a free medical camp for blood pressure, sugar level and general consultation in puliyur village. A self defence workshop was conducted for the other batch of volunteers and Sevalaya hostel students by **Mr Mohammed Rafi**, Vice President, All India KenwaShitoryu. It was followed by Jam making workshop by the nutritionist Mr. **Manoj** for the volunteers and the hostel students. Then our NSS volunteers conducted sports for the Sevalaya school students. Following the volley ball match, prize distribution ceremony was held in the evening after which a self development program was organized for the NSS volunteers. Mr. **Arputhanesan**, a Psychologist and life skills coach enlightened the students on the secret of success and



engaged them with intellectual activities. Following a break, students took part in story narration in which they entertained their fellow volunteers with creative and interesting stories.

On the fifth day, the volunteers planted saplings in the Sevalaya premises as part of their fieldwork. Then they visited the old-age home in Sevalaya and interacted with the inhabitants to take a survey on their physical and mental health which would be submitted as a report to the Sevalaya coordinators. It was followed by a brief session by **Mr. Aravind**, an advocate who spoke about the Basics of the Indian Constitution to our volunteers. Like the previous day, the volunteers conducted various sports events for Sevalaya hostel students in which they played handball and basketball and had 200mts. dash. Following the prize distribution, the volunteers took part in treasure hunt organized by our alumni and former NSS leaders to find out as to how well the volunteers were acquainted with the places in Sevalaya during their stay there.

On the sixth day, the volunteers were engaged in cleaning and gardening as part of their field work. It was followed by English assessment for fifth class students to assess the English language skills of Primary level students. Then, our volunteers conducted a creative activity called “**Think out of the box**” for the seventh class students. A team of volunteers put on a mime show on plastic ban awareness and another team staged a street play in view of World Water Day for the school students following creative activities. It was followed by a personality and psychological test for the sevalaya hostel students to identify their personal problems which would be submitted as a report to the Sevalaya Coordinators.

On the seventh day, the special camp came to an end with the final analysis and feedback session, in which the volunteers shared their experiences and observations and also offered suggestions to be considered for the next camp. Following that, the valedictory session was presided over by the Chief Guest **Dr. Baskaran**, NSS Coordinator, University of Madras and **Dr. A Joseph Durai**, the Principal of Patrician College. The Chief Guest, in his special address, elaborated on the importance of NSS and Self development. Later, he interacted with the students and various feedbacks and experiences were shared with the gathering. The programme and the 7 days special camp ended with the Vote of Thanks which was proposed by a NSS Volunteer. The NSS volunteers carried home a bundle of good memories and enormous experience on the importance of serving the society.

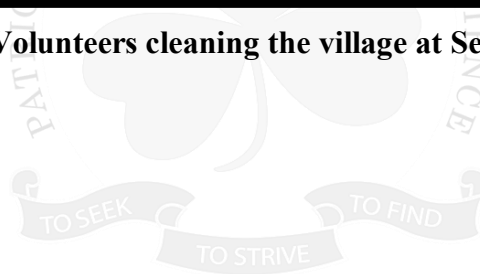

Thiruvarur**

Cyclone Gaja hit the delta region of Tamil Nadu very badly causing severe damages to the lives and the livelihood of the people living there in December 2018. The Management of Patrician College of Arts and Science intended to alleviate the misery of the people to the possible extent by their own means with the support of the Staff and the Students. The sleepy villages in and around Thiruvarur, Nagappattinam and Pattukkottai bore the brunt of the cyclonic damage were picked out and tagged in for the scope of our work.

The fund was raised from the staff and the students. The Management contributed enormously for the noble cause. An amount to the tune of 15 lakh of rupees was gathered in a short span of time. With the money collected, materials including mat, bed sheets, rice, cereals and other essentials were bought and segregated. Under the supervision of Brother Dr. Johnson Rex Dhanapal, Director and Secretary, Dr. A. Joseph Durai, Principal and Dr. Arockia Mary Geetha Doss, Vice Principal, the staff members and the students advanced the segregation work in college the day before starting for the relief work. Then the segregated materials were piled up in the buses and a team of 140 members including Brother, Principal, Vice principal, the staff and the students left for distributing the relief materials to the needy in the selected regions.

The team went about the remote villages where the relief was until then done scanty. With the help of few noble souls from the villages who came forward immediately on our arrival, the worst affected families were identified and grouped. The relief materials were distributed to the people in a harmonious arrangement of them. More than 1000 Families were benefitted over the relief materials. There wasn't any commotion till the last moment as we had a prior plan of what to do and how to deal with as charted out by Brother Johnson. People welcomed our efforts and it was a satisfying experience for all of us. The involvement of the students was vital as they delivered the allotted works with great enthusiasm. It's really a learning of a new kind to the staff and the students.

2018 onwards Patrician College of Arts and Science started organizing Job Fair every year. Job Fair had conducted on 10th March 2019 with over 50 companies recruiting for more than 6000 and odd vacant posts. This year the Job Fair was conducted with the collaboration of CII (Confederation of Indian Industries). The National Career Service majorly conducts in-person career fairs in collaboration with Model Career Centre which is facilitated by Confederation of Indian Industry. The day was a unique opportunity to form partnerships between potential employers and employees. Job Fair also aims at providing an equal chance to the candidates to represent themselves and get the fair opportunity to get absorbed.

Different sectors available for recruiting candidates were IT, Finance, Marketing, Manufacturing, Engineering, Retail, Hospitality, E-Learning, Animation, Staffing, Logistics, NGO, Telecom, Pharma, Healthcare, Nursing, Health Insurance, Construction and BPO.

“Opportunities don’t happen, you create them.” This year, the job fair witnessed a total of 2174 candidates (1304 male and 870 female) participated in the process, of which 368 (201 male and 167 female) were selected and another 647 applicants were shortlisted for further rounds of which 392 were male and 255 female candidates. There were 79 employers offering 10,125 job openings in all, in this fair. 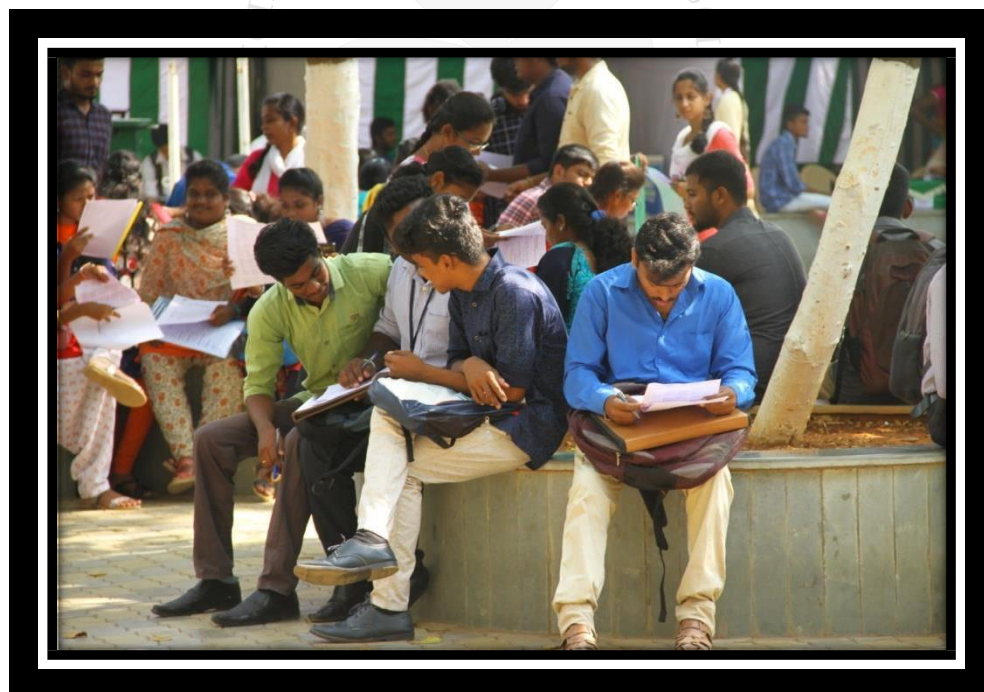

Anugraha Sadan, Home for children with Cerebral Palsy and multiple handicaps, is situated in Chalakudy, one of the worst affected areas in the floods that has ravaged Kerala. This home was started in 2005 with 5 orphaned children who had cerebral palsy. Now there are 28 children with cerebral palsy, mostly orphaned or deserted by their parents. Few are now adults left with the care givers, unwanted by their parents.

On 15th August, when the floods engulfed their 2 storey home, they had nowhere to go. They were given temporary shelter in the auditorium of St James hospital in Chalakudy, Kerala.

They lost everything no bed, no food, no clothing Anugraha Sadan is a home for those who have no voice. They don't have government patronage and no funding from any religious organization. They are solely dependent on the generosity of well meaning individuals.

The faculty and students of Patrician College reached out to them collectively. An amount of Rs 1,66,400/- was raised and sent to Anugraha Sadan.

Let us hope that the money collected by our students and faculty brought solace and comfort to these helpless victims of the flood in their darkest hour.

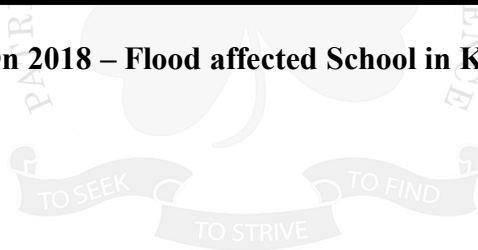

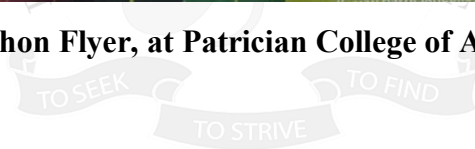

For many years now, rural and urban development is being treated as a distinct specialization in social work education and a system of field work training in this specialization had already been introduced. Without broad theoretical study and extensive field practices, professional knowledge cannot be developed. Hence, a comprehensive field study and practical demonstrations in a community will perfect social workers, students in their objectives to learn about the society.

The students will understand the social system with the dynamics within and they make a detailed analysis of the regional social system, the approaches, and the strategies of intervention used by the government and non-government organisations. The students will understand the nature of government intervention in relation to various groups (caste, tribe etc.) in the region, and the related structures of decision-making and intervention. The students develop the capacity to critique the interventions of both the voluntary organisations and the government agencies in relation to the specific group.

Through experience in group-living the student should learn to appreciate its value in terms of self-development, interpersonal relationships, sense of organisation, management and taking on responsibility. There are all possibilities for acquiring skills in planning, organising, implementing through the camp for example: conscious use of time, communication skills, team spirit, handling relationships, conflicts and differences of opinion, decision making, evaluation, appreciation, sharing of resources, tasks, coping skills in problem situations, cooperation and coordination. The students will be fully involved in planning, implementing the plans and presenting their experience in a workshop on return from the camp.

**DAY: 1****DATE: 06/08/2018**

The Trainees started their journey of Rural Camp from the college at 7:00am to Thondamanallur in the district of Kanchipuram. 38 Trainees along with 2 Field Work Co-ordinators accommodated in a 52 seater bus and reached the destination at 9:40am. The Trainees started accommodating in the rooms given. Within 10:40 am the trainees cleaned up the rooms and made their accommodations neat. The trainees relaxed and started planning and preparing for the Inauguration Programme that ought to be performed in the evening. The Trainees went for Transient Walk. The programme practice started with the Camp Song and preparation of Mime went on. The Cooking Process started from 12:15pm to 2:00pm with the help of a cook. The Trainees had lunch at 2:30pm. The practice for the programme continued. The Inauguration Programme started at 6:20pm. The Trainees invited the Community people to witness the Programme. The programme ended at 7:30pm. At 8:00pm the Trainees had dinner.

DAY: 2**DATE: 07/08/2018**

The Trainees woke up at 6:00am and refreshed, prepared for the Morning Walk to clean up the ground at 6:30am. The Trainees conducted Sports Day for the children in the Community. The ground was cleaned and the track was set up for the Sports Day Event. At 9:00am the Trainees had breakfast. At 9:45am the Trainees took Survey in the school about the number of students and took the students to the ground and gave them instructions about the Events conducted. At 10:35am the Sports Day started.

SPORTS DAY:

At 10:35am the Sports Event started. The students from 1st to 8th std were divided into four groups. The Red Team started with the Frog Race for the 1st and 2nd std. The Yellow Team done with the Running Race. The Green Team done with the Meters race. The blue team done with the water fills up game. The Green and Blue Team done had Stone Game. The Sports Day veined up at 12:40pm. At 2.00 pm the Trainees had lunch. From 2:45 to 3:20pm the Sports Day prize distribution took place.

COMMUNITY VISIT:

At 4:00pm the survey/community walk was processed by the trainees. The trainees were separated in pairs and were given survey forms to communicate with the people in the community and to take survey about them. The survey consists of their life style and the problems faced by them.

**DAY: 3****DATE: 08/08/2018**

The trainees woke up at 6:00am. At 6:30am all the leaders were given special instructions and the schedule of the day was discussed. At 8:00am the trainees had breakfast.

COMMUNITY ANALYSIS:

At 9:15am the Trainees prepared themselves for the Community Visit and called the children of the Community to give them awareness and to entertain them with Sports Activities, Music and Dance. Personnel Counseling was given to teenage girls by the Female Trainees based on mood swings and problems faced by them.

SOCIAL MAPPING:

The Trainees were divided into groups and each group were given charts to draw Social Mappings.

MIME PLAY:

Mime Play was performed by the Trainees to the Community based on the Awareness of Drug Addiction.

DAY: 4**DATE: 09/08/2018****COMMUNITY CLEANING**

The Trainees got up at 5:00am and refreshed and prepared for community cleaning from 6:30am to 7:30am. All the plastics and the waste products were picked up and dumped in a separate pit. The drainage was also cleaned up.

CULTURAL PROGRAM PRACTICE:

The Cultural Program practice was started from 9:00am onwards and the practice ended at 4:00pm. The practice included Dances, Awareness Skit, Awareness Speech and Street Play.

CULTURAL EVENT:

The Cultural Program was very well organized and performed without any flaws. The Dance Trainer along with his students gave a Special Performance with an Awareness Song based on Drug Addiction and Cast Discrimination. The Trainees performed Awareness Skit On Child Marriage, Awareness Play on Humanity, Traditional Dances and Awareness Speech. The Community enjoyed the Events. The Program started at 5:00pm and ended at 7:30pm.

DAY: 5

DATE: 10/08/2018

CLEANING THE LOCALITY:

At 8:30am the Trainees went for community cleaning where all the plastics and the waste products were cleaned up and dumped into a separate pit.

CONDUCTING DRAWING COMPETITION:

The Trainees conducted Drawing Competition in the



school for children and selected the best drawings.

The Rural camp was organized for ten days at Thandalam Village, Maduranthakam Taluk, Kancheepuram District from 24th September to 3rd October by the Department of Social Work, Patrician College of Arts and Science for the students of 1st MSW (2018- 2020). It provided an opportunity to gain practical skills and be exposed to the rural areas. It was organized with an objective to create a platform for the students to understand and analyze the Rural Social System, Nature of Government Intervention for the development of poor people and to facilitate student experiences of group living.
