






5.1 Student Support

The objectives of the program were to make the students aware of various stages in Civil Services Examination and methods of preparation.





Prof. D. Stalin started his address by giving detailed information about the stages in civil services exam. He explained to the students about the marks allotted for all the preliminary, main and personality test.
