#### **AGENDA 6 – Principal's Report**

#### Academic performance of our students

The College celebrated its 15<sup>th</sup> Graduation day on Saturday, the 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2019 in our campus. The chief guest Dr. S.P. Thyagarajan, former Vice-Chancellor of University of Madras and now Professor of Eminence & Dean (Research) Sri Ramachandra University, declared the graduation day open and in his presidential address he congratulated the graduands. In the University exams held in April 2017 & 18, out of the **1417**candidates who appeared for the examinations in various disciplines, **1055** candidates successfully passed. The College has secured an overall pass percentage of **75%** of which **140** candidates secured University ranks in various subjects.

60 candidates have secured First class with distinction and 571candidates have secured First class.

We congratulate all the rank holders for their achievements.

#### **Faculty Achievements and Research Activities:**

27 Members of the teaching faculty are doctorates. 3 faculty members were awarded Ph.D. degree in this academic year. Teachers attend seminars and workshops. 35 Research papers were presented and published by our faculty. 17 faculty members are pursuing Ph.D. Programme.

Ms. SathyaPriya, Head, Department of Tamil, was awarded Ph. D on 21<sup>st</sup> July 2018 by University of Madras.

Ms. B. Meena, Head, Department of Commerce, was awarded Ph. D on 29th August 2018 by Dravidian University.

Ms. Sindhu Sivan, Head, Department of Social Work, was conferred Ph. D on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2018 by University of Madras.

Congratulations to the three members of our faculty who have received their doctoral degrees this year.

#### IQAC

The internal quality assurance cell pursues its action plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of higher education for the institution. It functions based on the recommendations of NAAC for monitoring the quality measures in the college. The IQAC conducts several sessions for faculty and students to emulate and enhance them the system and procedures. It also aims for the application of quality parameters of the college.

#### Conferences / Seminars / Workshops organized by various departments

Our college values continuing education and constantly encourages the departments to organize conferences, seminars and workshops. Thus it creates opportunities for the faculty to develop them professionally and also to disseminate knowledge. A number of conferences and workshops were organized by various departments during the academic year. Here are the details:

#### Conferences

The department of Social Work organized a two-day national conference on "Youth Well – Being: Challenges and Perspectives" on 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019.

The departments of Commerce, Corporate Secretaryship, Business Administration, Commerce (Accounting and Finanace) oraganised a two-day national seminar on "Ethics, Entrepreneurship & Sustainable Development" on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> March 2019.

The department of Tamil in association with Ulaga Tamil AraichiNiruvanam will be organizing a one-day international conference on "ChevillakiyagalilPanmugaParvai" on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2019.

Besides conferences, a number of seminars, workshops, and guest lectures were organized by various departments, which provided our faculty and students with opportunities to develop themselves professionally and academically.

This event gives us a great opportunity to highlight the achievements accomplished by the college of this academic year. The college has excelled not only in the academics but also in co-curricular and extra -curricular activities.

#### **Celebrations and Activities of the College:**

The year 2018 -19 was a resounding year with a lot of activities and celebrations for the students as well as the faculty members. Induction Programme, Investiture Ceremony, Fresher's day, College Anniversary, Independence Day, Brother's birthday, Teacher's Day, Christmas celebrations, Thai Pongal, 70<sup>th</sup> Republic Day, Founder's Day, St. Patrick's Feast Day are the important celebrations of the college.

**The 18th Annual Sports Meet** was held on 15th September 2018. The Chief Guest of the Day was Mr. V. Nanda Kumar, IRS, Joint Commissioner Income Tax AayakarBhavan, Chennai. The Best march past trophies were awarded to BBA, B.Com (G) and B.Com (CS) departments which bagged I, II and III places respectively. Individual championship for Women trophy was awarded to M. Rekha, II M.Com with the scoring of 1167 Points calculated through IAAF Scoring Format and the Individual championship for Men trophy was awarded to Luquemangani of III B.Com (G) with the total scoring of 2401 points. The overall winner's trophy was awarded to the department of Commerce, the runner up trophy was bagged by BCA department, and the second runner up trophy was awarded to BSC Mathematics department.

#### Students' achievements in Sports and Games:

Our students participated and won in many sports events such as Boxing, Handball, Karate, skating, cricket and athletics, as an individual and also as a team they brought many laurels to the college.

#### STUDENT SUPPORT SYSTEM

**Reading club** along with the Department of English introduced "A word for the Day" on 14<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The students were given a word for the day along with the meaning, pronunciation and its usage and the members persuade them for a book review analysis.

**Source Hub, the placement cell actively functions to bring forth more number of recruiters and this year saw participation from major recruiters like Wipro, IndusInd Bank, RR Donnelley,** 

TCS, Sutherland, Sundaram Finance, Just Dial, Zilker Technology, Infosys, Adecco, Website Learners to name a few. Students were offered various coveted roles in Analytics, Consulting, E-commerce, Banking and Technology Consulting.

NIIT has organized a week long placement training inside the campus for the arrear students. Certificates were provided after the completion of the course. To make students well equipped with the company processes, Source Hub has managed to arrange an Industrial Visit for the Nil Arrear students to Wipro. Other Seminars and Mock interview sessions were also conducted for the final year students to make them train in reasoning abilities.

#### **Certificate Courses**

This year certificate course was introduced in association with ePalmleaf ITES Private Limited, Bangalore. The course BAP Executive (GST Compliant) certified by NSDC was conducted. 85 students across disciplines were the beneficiaries. The course is completely online, interactive and focuses on experiential learning. It offers knowledge on documentation, finance and accounting process. It builds confidence in students to face interviews.

The College has active academic collaborations with NPTEL and SWAYAM past three semesters both students and faculty members are encouraged to participate in the courses and around 170 students and 9 faculty members successfully completed their courses.

**Parents Teachers Meeting** for odd and even semester was a short discussion between the parents and teachers of students to discuss their progress at college and find solutions to academic or behavioral problems. Around 65% parents attended both the meetings.

**Scholarship**, the college continues to encourage the needy and deserving students by providing financial assistance through the management and also by the department of AdiDravidar and Tribal welfare offered Government Scholarships. A total of Rupees **28,00,550** was disbursed to the students. Welfare of Minorities provides post-metric scholarship for meritorious students from minority communities. A total of 84 students have applied for this scholarship from various departments. Fee concession is granted to needy and deserving students, the management generously granted a total of Rupees **15, 01,867** for **53** needy and they were grateful to the management. St. Louis scholarship fund extended by St. Louis church, Adyar has short listed **19** of our students for the scholarship from various departments based on their means and merit and

Rs. **2,28,000** was disbursed and also Kerala Catholic Society funds amounting of Rs. **4,50,000** was diverted to St. Louis scholarship and 45 students were benefitted. Mahindra Finance granted Rupees **90,000** and **9** students were the beneficiaries.

#### Activities of various cells and clubs:

In keeping with the vision of providing holistic education, various clubs and cells actively engages the students and encouraged them to participate in various events. The Clubs such as Leo Club,Rotaract Club, NSS, Citizen Consumer Club, Enviro Club, Civil Services Cell, AICUF, Women's Cell, Literacy Cell, YRC, ED Cell, Fine Arts Club, and Kalaiyagamoffer a mixture of indoor and outdoor activities to its students. It is to be noted that by gaining exposure through these clubs and cells, many students in their first year of the course have learnt and excelled in co-curricular and extra-curricular competitions.

Alumni: The Alumni Meet for 2018-19 were held on 19<sup>th</sup> Jan and 26<sup>th</sup> January2019. Many expatricians placed in various fields came to celebrate their nostalgic moments of bygone days. This home was started in 2005 with 5 orphaned children who had cerebral palsy. Now there are 28 children with cerebral palsy, mostly orphaned or deserted by their parents. The faculty and students of Patrician College reached out to them collectively. An amount of Rs 1,66,400/- was raised and sent to AnugrahaSadan.

#### Gaja Cyclone

Cyclone Gaja hit the delta region of Tamil Nadu very badly causing severe damages to the lives and the livelihood of the people living over there in December 2018. The fund was raised from the staff and the students. The Management contributed enormously for the noble cause. An amount to the tune of 15 lakhs was gathered in a short span of time. Materials including mat, bed spreads, rice, cereals and other essentials were bought and segregated. A team of 140 members went for distributing the relief materials to the needy in selected regions. More than 1000 Families of Thiruthuraipundi and Vedharanyamwere benefitted over the relief materials.

The groups brought various genres of music to the stage in which they showcased their talent in praise of Jesus Christ through the form of carols. #### Job Fair 2019

# Agenda - 6 – PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I am happy to present the report to the members of the Governing body.

### Results

The overall pass percentage, as assessed by the Madras University for 2013 - 2016 stands at **80.69%** and marks an increase 6.59% over and above the performance of 2012 - 2015. In 2015 - 16 the Patrician College contributed a total of **418 new graduates** for the job market.

#### **Faculty Achievement**

The Patrician **family of teachers consists of 87** men and women. Of them **23** are **Ph.D**s; **22** more are **NET** qualified. **44** hold **M.Phil** Degrees, **22** are **pursuing Ph.Ds**. They have won many awards for their academic excellence.

### Academic Audit

As part of our resolve to continue `A' Grade quality, we subjected ourselves to an **External Academic Audit**. 26 serving and retired Principals, drawn from established colleges in Chennai, conducted an External Academic Audit on 6<sup>th</sup> October 2016 commencing with the scrutiny of the performance of the Principal. The many valuable suggestions made by the external academic audit team have already been implemented by a management, ready to see reason in academic demands and loose its purse strings liberally.

#### New Academic Programmes

In our quest for massification of higher education, and in our desire to grow, we have asked the parent University to permit us to offer additionally five **new UG Programmes from the next academic year** – B.Com (Accounting & Fin), B.Sc Electronic Media, BCA, B.Com (Gen) and B.Com (Corp Sec). We have moved the Tamil Nadu Music University for permission to offer B.A. Western Music. If all goes well, we will be the first academic institution in Tamil Nadu to offer B.A. (Western Music) course.

All Departments on campus are in possession of **Laptops** and state - of - the art **smart boards**. The departments of English and Commerce, stand thoroughly renovated, and are the envy of their friends on other campuses.

#### Infrastructure

The Brothers of St. Patrick are keen to ensure the safety of students, give them good education and shape them into men and women of moral fibre. Spending lakhs, they have put in place a new software, which informs the parents, at 8.45 a.m. every single day, whether their child has come to the college or not. The **96 CCTV cameras** installed on campus and at the entrance, help even the Police holding jurisdiction, to step up surveillance.

The two new **RO water plants** ensure safe drinking water for all students on campus. The students requested a new facility – Nets for cricket practice, a new long jump pit and repairs to the football field. The management, I record thankfully has spent a total of 45,20,000/- (Rupees Forty Five lakhs twenty thousand) this academic year towards infrastructural improvements.

### **Extension Services**

The college cares for the welfare of its students in a comprehensive manner. It has organized a **free dental camp, free eye screening** and an exclusive health and hygiene camp for girl students. The hematological profiles of all girl students were carried out to rule out iron deficiency in association with Malar Hospital.

#### **Appointment of Counsellor**

The college Management ever sensitive to the needs and aspirations of the students, and in fulfillment of the PTA wish, appointed a very qualified and competent person **Dr. V.S.Anita as a counseling psychologist**. She has been holding in camera meetings with students requiring emotional support and therapy and is doing the needful on scientific lines.

#### Safety and Security

The college believes in providing more security measures during the days of protest and strike. On the day Jallikuttu protest turned violent, 1400 parents were contacted in a span of less than 40 minutes and all the students were personally handed over to their respective parents.

#### **Parents Teachers Association**

The college acts in close co-ordination with the parents. The **PTA**, led by Dr. Ayyasamy, a renowned orthopedican, a Patrician product himself, meets with the Management and the Principal. The PTA has held five meetings so far. In the meeting held with individual parents on the comprehensive welfare of their children, a total of 1560 parents took part in the one to one consultations, which are very fruitful.

#### Placement

The **placement cell has enabled 100 students** get comfortable jobs. The Placement cell initiated 9 needy students to receive scholarship a sum of Rs.10000/- each.

#### **Student Council**

The Patrician College of Arts and Science is a strong believer in inculcating leadership qualities in our learners. We conducted Student Union Elections in an open and fair manner. The **Student Council was inaugurated by Thiru. Arun Sundar Dayalan, IAS**, a Tamil Nadu Officer. They raised funds, way of small in sum, but tremendous in intent. I must record to the credit of my students, that they ensured free and fair elections, evolved a cohesive and well – knit student union

council which listened to the management with reverence and to the Principal with respect. Remarkably young in years, Mark Angelo and his nine members team, hit upon the idea of 'Build Life Foundation'.

These senior students are in no need to be told of any UGC diktat on ragging. They welcome the **freshers** with flowers, music and dance. **Col T.L Kumar**, Sr Security Officer, HVF Avadi, a pride of India was the Guest of Honour.

### **Skilled Development Programmes**

This academic year saw some very noteworthy events. The college keen to motivate our students towards joining the Civil Services like the IAS and the IPS and formed a **`Centre for Preparatory Excellence for National Civil Services'** in the sacred name of Bro. Aloysious. Thiru. S.Nagarajan IAS, Director `e' Governance, Govt. of Tamil Nadu and the 1996 National Topper in the UPSC examination was the Chief Guest and he inaugurated the Bro. Aloysius Centre on 01.08.2016. Thiru. S.Saravanan, IAS Ms.J Jose Antro Healtha, IFS were the other guests of Honour. The talk given by Ms.Nitya Selvakumar on why and how to become and IAS officer held the students spellbound. Superior Bro. M.K.Francis planted a sandal sapling on our campus to mark the occasion.

The College, without any financial assistance from the UGC or the MHRD, carries out whatever the UGC wants Higher Education institutions to do. It has set up **HEPSN**, a centre to enable students with special needs to complete Higher Education, Shri N.S.Venkatarmanan, Founder, Nandhini Voice of the Deprived and Mrs. Harini Vasanthan vision Rehabilitationist sensitized the neurotypical students to the needs of special children and adults. I must add with pride that PCAS has been truly inclusive in its approach and has admitted 21 students with dyslexia – Comprehensive Learning Disability – into UG PRogrammes to which they fit in.

A very noteworthy research work is carried out by seven students of this college, in developing user friendly portals for parents of special children. This is a project carried out in collaboration with the Paris – based **`Centre for Interdisciplinarity Research' affiliated to the University of Paris**. I am happy to state that Patrician College of Arts and Science is planning to sing an MOU with the Paris-University affiliate.

Another noteworthy effort of the college in the Add – on certificate programme of 3 months duration given in collaboration with the **Madras Chamber of Commerce and Industries on `Introduction to Logistics'** 34 students of Commerce and Corporate Secretaryship underwent the programme and were awarded certificates by the MCCI after completion of many rounds of evaluation.

### **Department Activities**

The Departments of Commerce and related subjects held a **conference** on the aftermath of demonetization. Experts who talked included **VMA Murali** of the ICWA and Dr.R.K. Raghavan, Former Director, CBI.

The department of Social Work conducted a two –day **international conference on `Including the Differently – abled'** bringing experts from France, Germany, UAE and Indian activists to address issues relating to meaningful inclusion.

The Department of English is **celebrating Shakespeare** and his relevance 400 years after the bard's demise. Veteran Indra Parthasarthy is going to be the guest of honour on 08.03.2017, when our students are going to shower in the soliloquies of Shakespeare and walk in Elizabethan costumes.

On 07.03.2017, the college is celebrating **International Women's Day** by honouring Dr.Shantha, Founder of the Cancer Institute and Sr.Jecintha, Principal, Stella Maris for their services. Specialists are going to talk on `Law for Indian Women' and Cyber Safety for Young Women.

#### **Extracurricular activities**

For the first time in the history of the college an **intercollegiate cultural festival** was held. Named Phantasia, the mega event was held on  $28^{th}$  &  $29^{th}$  September 2016 in which many teams drawn from 45 colleges and universities took part. The Patricians as host institution put up only guest performances. The Management generously supported Phantasia with funding and logistic support.

Our students are excelling in sports and showcasing their talents in **sports** at international and national, state, and zonal level.

Our student Shurdan Sivakumar of II B.Sc (Psychology) played Tournaments in the USA for Last Three Years. At present he trains and counsels tennis players in Havefords College at Villanava University International (US Consulate Chennai). He is a managing committee member with ATP Chennai and IPL Sunrises Hyderabad.

I take this opportunity to record my sincere thanks to the Vice Chancellor of the Tamil Nadu Sports Dr.A.M.Moorthy for gracing the college Sports Day as the Chief Guest.

#### Conclusion

In conclusion I must make some observations. It calls for sustained and co-ordinated efforts on the part of educationists, institution builders and parents in joining hands to wean away our youngsters from the inbuilt dangers lurking in communication technology, in the use of which the elders are learners and the youngsters are past

masters. Unguided, there is every danger of our youngsters turning into rumour mongers, hate merchants and consumers of 'e' waste of a virulent type. The lure of frivolous information peddled through social media is the reason for a mere 50 students of this college, taking a simple examination on the Life of Mahatma Gandhiji. The Patrician College assures the parents that we will continue to be with you in this sacred work of Channeling the energies of their children.

For all our praiseworthy work, I say that they were made possible by Superior M.K. Francis, Bro. Sebastian, Former Director, Bro. - 4. Directors Report . Bro. Dr. Arockiaraj, presented the report for the period June 2015 to October 2015 and the same was taken note.
- 5. Principals report Dr. Fatima Vasanth, Principal presented the report for the period June 2015 to October 2015. The report covered on academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities of the faculty and students. The report was taken note.
- 6. Appointment of Faculty The Governing Body approved the vacancy and appointment of new faculty members. The appointments will be completed by January 2016.
- 7. Remarks by the University Representative The following suggestions were made by Dr. Hanifa Ghosh
- Dr. Hanifa Ghosh suggested that the certificate courses be linked to life skills. This would be more effective if the courses were linked to the Entrepreneurial Development cell where skills with business prospects could be developed to make students self reliant and not dependent on others for employment. She mentioned that holistic coverage of soft skills are also a mandatory part of the University syllabus and need not be brought under certificate courses again.
- Dr. Hanifa Ghosh put forward the case study of CTTE college and mentioned that the Entrepreneurial Development cell was thriving there with life skills courses like cosmetology, costume and jewellery designing, tailoring, embroidering, fabric painting, bakery classes. She suggested to tie up with organizations which can provide training for these skills.
- Dr. Hanifa Ghosh requested information on the fees for Entrepreneurial Development cell and the Vice Principal, Dr. Arokiamary Geetha Doss, mentioned that the Commerce department anchors the cell with a fee of Rs. 50 per member. She also mentioned that trainers come in free of course charging only for material cost.
- Dr. Hanifa Ghosh presented her college initiative in housing a fully operational bakery unit and mentioned that the government is looking to sponsor such initiatives with monetary and recognition support so that vocational skills may be developed to counter lack of employability among students. The Principal assured that the Entrepreneurial

Development cell would be furthered and encouraged to improve its services in supporting students' employability.

- With regards to counseling services, Dr. Hanifa Ghosh enquired as to the nature of counseling services. The Principal replied that all the faculty participate in providing counseling to students on case-to-case basis in the form of mentoring. The in-house counselors are from the Faculties of Social Work and Psychology. There are no separate professional counselors.
- With regards to placement services, Dr. Hanifa Ghosh suggested to recruit a separate professional placement officer who is from the corporate world so that connections with corporate bodies will be easier to establish. Rev. Bro. Dr. Arockiaraj replied that the placement officer is from a corporate background and currently teaches only two hours per day giving him adequate time to see to placement initiatives and follow ups.
- Dr. Hanifa Ghosh placed on record her appreciation for all the efforts culminating in the awarding of A grade to the college on its first NAAC cycle. She also said that she has mentioned about Patrician College Library in her college. She ensured that she will pray for the success of Patrician College in the future.

#### Agenda 6 – PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### STUDENTS ADMISSION

The college reopened on the  $18^{th}$  June for the  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  years and on  $26^{th}$  June for the first years. To meet the increasing demand for education, three UG programmes (BSW, B.Sc Maths, B.Sc Psy) and one PG programme (M.A. English) were inducted. Dr. S. Karunanidhi, Professor and Head, Dept of Psychology, University of Madras was the chief guest of the day and inaugurated the New Academic Programmes. Our admission status continues to show an upward trend. During the academic year 2015 – 2016, a total of 821 students were admitted to the UG and PG level. The College now functions with a strength of 1958 students with 10 under graduate and 3 Post Graduate degree programmes.

#### **UNIVERSITY RESULTS**

Out of 473 candidates who took the University examinations in various disciplines in the Arts and Science stream, 353 successfully passed. The college has secured an overall pass percentage of 74.6% of which 45 candidates secured university ranks in various subjects and several distinctions. Sunil Joseph from the Department of Computer Science and Kevin Mario Daswood from the department of commerce secured 1<sup>st</sup> Rank in French. Rachel Rose Marie shepherd from the Department of Corporate Secretaryship secured 8<sup>th</sup> Rank, and Mejina James of the same department secured 9<sup>th</sup> Rank in French.

# IQAC

#### LIBRARY

The Library is the heartbeat of an Institution. The Library has expanded with a vast collection of around 16,145 books, 23 national journals and 7 international journals. This academic year new books were purchased for Rs. 1,17,931. Various events were conducted such as Tamil essay writing, English Essay Writing, Collage, Quiz and Game show. A Book Fair was held on the 10<sup>th</sup> August 2015 - A Book Fair was held with 10 book stalls and one Magazine stall on at the college auditorium. 250 books were purchased for the central library. The college subscribed corporate membership with the British Council Library. 10 Oct, 2015 - Seven students participated in the British Council Orientation Programme.

#### PLACEMENT

All the final year UG students were encouraged and motivated to pursue Post Graduation programmes in Patrician College and in other recognized colleges/ universities. Students were oriented towards the different job opportunities in Multi National Companies, International Banks, Auditing Firms, Software companies, Digital companies and in Government sector. Students were trained in Resume writing, Group Discussion, Role Play, and Interview skills. Sutherland conducted campus interview and selected 28 students. Sutherland offered Part-time job opportunities for the second and third year students. TCS IGNITE team conducted pre-placement talks for B.Sc. Computer Science and BCA students to register with TCS IGNITE to avail E-resources, practices aptitude tests and participate in the interview process. TCS IT has selected 6 students and issued the offer letters.

Placement cell has coordinated with Mahindra Finance for Scholarship Programme. The senior HR team from Mahindra Finance disbursed Rs. 1,30,000/ as scholarship to 13 needy students and offered jobs. Mahindra Finance provided flood relief materials to our students. The campus placement drive was successful this academic year too. Reputed companies visited our campus for placement viz. RR Donnelley, ICICI Prudential, AGS Health, Sutherland, Just Dial, and selected 140 students. Off campus opportunity was offered by TCS IT, Syntel, Yodlee, Cavin Care etc. Average salary offered to a student is Rs. 15,000/- per month. Highest salary offered by Just Dial is Rs. 26,000/- per month plus benefits. Students was immensely happy to start their career after their sixth semester. Placement help desk will continuously guide students for off- campus jobs and higher education.

The Alumni Association hosts regular Alumni functions to give opportunities for the alumni to continue to be a part of its Alma Mater. # **MENTORING & COUNSELLING**

11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> August 2015 – The mentoring unit of the college formed and aims at the holistic development of students, framed student-centric goals for UG students based on the academic year they are in. The faculty mentors were trained for two days to help their allotted mentees during the mentoring time towards the planned goal. Every second Friday of the month the mentor interacts with the allotted wards and discusses issues, academic and non academic and finds solutions as the case may be. If any requires counseling he or she is referred to College counselor for review. The mentor records each session and maintains a monthly file on the progress of the mentee. The ratio of mentor –mentee is 1:10.

Psychology counseling services were established by Dr. Lydia Eric and Dr. Solomon, Department of Psychology in July 2015. Counselling cell maintains focus on facilitating personal and interpersonal functioning across students and faculties. The Cell pays particular attention to emotional, social, vocational, educational and health related concerns. The recommendation for the counseling session is through the Management, Faculty or the Student himself or herself.

# SCHOLARSHIPS

The College management was concern with underprivileged sections of the student community and in keeping with the ideals, contributes by giving the fee concession to the deserving students and financial weak students irrespective of their religion. The Scholarship committee worked hard to ensure and encourage getting the funds for the underprivileged students.

## LIBRARY

The Library has expanded with a vast collection of around 16,145 books, 23 national journals and 7 international journals. The Library committee organizes several programmes to promote reading habits among students. Library Week was organized from 27<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2015. The **Reading Club** of Patrician College was inaugurated on 27<sup>th</sup> July, 2015. **Frequent Library Users** among staff and students were identified and awarded prizes in the ceremony. A Book Fair was held on 31<sup>st</sup> July 2015 to increase the students' interest in books.

#### STUDENTS SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

#### STUDENT MENTORING

The College has a Mentoring Unit which carries out effective Mentoring of the students through monthly sessions conducted with a different year-wise agenda. The mentoring of students is focused on Academic Goals in the first year, Personal Goals in the second year and Career Exploration Goals in the third year. The mentor is mainly a facilitator in the mentoring process to encourage the student to grow through the sharing of ideas, attitudes, and grievances. Those students who have been identified as having alternative behavior patterns are sent for Counseling sessions with the in-house counselors from the Departments of Social Work and Psychology.

#### SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarships are made available to the deserving students through the Government schemes, Private organizations and Management Scholarships.

#### PLACEMENT

Placement services for 2015-16 have commenced. Organizations are invited for on campus and off campus. Advertisements for jobs in Government and private sectors are displayed on the placement notice board. All the final and second year UG students were given class-wise career orientation to scale up the placement opportunities across sectors and verticals. Students were trained in Resume preparation and Group Discussion. Training on Communication skills is imparted through the Patrician College Empowerment Cell.

#### PATRICIAN COLLEGE EMPOWERMENT CELL

To ensure that the students graduating out of the institution are equipped with additional skill sets, the college has started value added certificate courses under the 'Patrician College Empowerment Cell'. Certificate course one per semester has been mandatory for the first years and optional for the second and third years. The courses are offered with professional organizations with an MOU.

#### WOMEN'S CELL

In order to meet the growing demand for higher education amongst women candidates, Patrician College has a facilitative atmosphere to ensure that the needs of women students are being met to the fullest possible levels. The College has a Women's Cell which creates an environment of handholding and enhancement in the development of women students. The Cell organized a Health Awareness Programme on Reproductive Health for the women students and faculty on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2015. The resource person was Dr. Kalaivani MD, DGO, Apollo Clinic, Chennai.

#### **OTHER SUPPORT SERVICES**

Students with physical disabilities and slow learners are specially attended to. The College provides health insurance for all students and has linkages with private hospitals for immediate medical attention. The Anti Sexual Harassment cell, Ragging Redressal cell, Counseling services are the other systems set in place to provide support to student activity within the campus.

#### **EXTENSION ACTIVITIES**

In order to sensitize the students to a social bent of mind, the College undertakes extension activities under the banner **Patrician College Social Responsibility (PCSR)**. The Extension activity is anchored by the individual departments which includes 40 hours of community service by each department.

## **ALUMNI ASSOCIATION**

Alumni Meet was conducted on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2015and 380 alumni participated. The Executive Meeting of the Alumni Association for the current semester was held on 15<sup>th</sup> of August 2015. There is a good rapport between the Alumni and their alma mater Departments. Our Alumni have been invited as resource persons for seminars and workshops, judges of competitions, and chief guests for departmental events.

## PARENT TEACHERS ASSOCIATION

Parent Teacher Meeting was held on 25<sup>th</sup> July, 2015. 859 students (76.3%) accompanied by Parents attended the meet. The Class teachers and Subject teachers discussed the academic performance and behaviour of the students with the concerned parents. The General Body and the Executive Committee Meeting was conducted.

The meeting started with a prayer by Rev. Bro. M.K. Francis, Superior, Patrician Brothers, Chennai.

Rev. Bro. Dr. Arokiaraj, Director and Secretary of Patrician College, welcomed the gathering and gave introductory on the growth and development of the college. He placed on record his appreciation to the external members for accepting to serve the Academic Council of the college.

The agenda was taken for discussion

#### Agenda 2 - Principal's Report

Dr. Fatima Vasanth, Principal presented the academic report for the period June to October 2015. The report covered on academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities of the faculty and students. The report was taken note.

Discussion arising out of the Principals Report

• Dr. L.S. Ganesh suggested the presentation of data should give a more holistic picture and that admission details be connected with the cut off marks and how that affects admission. He stated the importance to capture the input of students with the qualifying marks and

show their growth year on year thus suggesting a time series data trend diagram for the past three years to understand the pattern of value addition to the students.

- He suggest bench marking with other colleges whose reports are available on their respective college websites so that the College could adopt the best practices of those colleges, or develop its own best practices to emerge to become the benchmark by itself. He also suggested the inclusion of qualitative notes on exceptional situations and performances.
- He appreciated the efforts of the college in undertaking numerous praiseworthy activities, one being the Patrician College Empowerment Cell (PCEC). He requested for more clarity on the course nature of PCEC and Dr. Gnanapushpam, Center Head, PCEC, stated the types of courses offered by PCEC and how it benefitted the students, especially the first generation learners. The Chairperson then added that the undertaking of such courses has been made mandatory from 2015-16 with each student taking up one course per semester, the course being Communication Skills Levels 1 and 2 for the first year of college.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh enquired about whether the collection of the fees for such certificate courses was extra or came within the fee structure. The Chairperson replied that the certificate course fee was collected as a part of the fee structure. He was highly appreciative of the fact that data of first generation learners was collected as a formal activity in the College.
- Dr. L.S.Ganesh enquired whether self-analysis was made during the conduct of the certificate courses. The Chairperson replied that there was a syndicate at the end of the course where students were appreciated with certificates of participation for undergoing the course, citing the incident of one particular student who could not communicate, prior to the course, a whole sentence in English, making a complete English presentation at the Valediction of the certificate Communication course. She stated that the current communication skills course was being run in a Memorandum of Understanding with Excel foundation.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh requested clarification on the extension activities undertaken by the College to which the Chairperson clarified the details of the extension activities as being aimed at sensitizing students to social needs and stating that it would be anchored by the respective Departments in addition to club wise social activity.
- Mr. T.A. Varghese suggested industrial visit for excellent students of the BCA, B.Sc Computer Science and B.Sc Mathematics courses to the TCS labs at Karapakkam where the students could gain knowledge of avenues available for opportunities apart from computer programming jobs. He also suggested that based on the success of such visits, TCS could facilitate a Faculty Development Programme. He also enquired about the placement for the aforementioned courses and stated the growing need for recruiting more graduates in the field of IT Infrastructure Services. The Chairperson replied that TCS was also one of the job providers for campus recruitments and she thanked the Industry Expert for his offer.

- Dr. L.S. Ganesh suggested the introduction of Department wise Faculty Development Programmes in addition to the existing college wise Faculty Development Programmes to impart more technical skill in the respective areas of each department.
- Dr. Ravindran, University representative wished the management all the best for the future and in doing so stated that the students strength is low compared to other colleges and suggested the planning of a roadmap in order to facilitate a 10 to 15 percent increase in students population over the next 5 years.
- His second area of concern was the lack of research activity with only 7 faculty presenting papers in the current semester and also compared the number of Ph.D holders to Non Ph.D holders saying that the figures revealed the flipside of the ratio. He also stated the marked lack of research activity across the University of Madras and suggested that the College takes more initiatives in the area of research such as Research Camps with focus on key departments, the output of which supercedes the current UGC initiatives to promote research. He emphasized the need for research motive to spring up from within the faculty and not just compliance to meeting an external pressure by the management. This could motivate the faculty to develop a better research culture within the College.
- With regard to clubs and associations, Dr. Ravindran dwelt upon the area of Cultural Activities suggesting that in addition to film stars and TV personalities being called, experts and professionals from the field like Folk artists and theater artists could be welcomed as judges. The Chairperson agreed with the view of Dr. Ravindran and stated the existence of the Fine Arts club which actively conducted Evoluzione '15, an inter departmental cultural extravaganza.
- Fr. Xavier Arulraj, Legal Expert, enquired about the placements and in particular, placement in government organizations or public sector undertakings. The Chairperson replied about the full-fledged Placement Cell which provides adequate placement opportunities to deserving candidates. She also stated the running of the Civil Services Cell which until now was a center of information regarding Civil Services examinations but would be taken up as a training facility for Civil Service and Government organization examinations through the PCEC.

#### Agenda 3 – Proposal For New Academic Programmes 2016-2017

Ms. Anandapriya B, Dean of Academics presented the proposals for new academic programmes. This agenda pertained to the introduction of new courses both in Shift 1 (M.Philprogrammes in Commerce and Social Work) and in Shift 2 (BCom, BCom CS, BSc Computer Science, BCA, BSc Statistics) as well as certificate diploma courses anchored by the PCEC.

- Dr. L.S. Ganesh appreciated the presence of justifications for each course but requested the statement of objectives for starting these courses. The Director replied that the objectives were to meet the market demand for jobs in related areas.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh enquired about the additional faculty required for running the new courses. The Director replied that for Shift 2, completely new set of faculty will be recruited.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh requested information on the number of faculty available to give a research slant to the institution, in specific enquiring about the workload of faculty. The Director replied that there was an average of 18 hours per week. To this Dr. L.S. Ganesh that it would be additionally taxing to take up a research course such as M.Phil Commerce and M.Phil Social Work because of the 18 teaching hours per week in addition to the quasi-academic work like coordination of clubs and associations. He also stated the need for research support system in the form of laboratories, databases, libraries in addition to other research facilities.
- Dr. Ravindran enquired in particular about the introduction of M.Phil Commerce and M.Phil Social Work and stated that M.Phil is steadily losing steam today and becoming redundant even as a pre doctoral degree.
- The Chairperson replied that the College has been known during its first 10 years as a UG college and then upgraded to PG in certain departments and then stated the intention of making the PG departments to research departments so that in the near future, PhD Degree could be brought in. This will attract more number of research scholars through whom research culture can be facilitated.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh gave suggestion of doing minor research projects from UGC level to which the Chairperson replied that the college should be granted 12 B 2(f) status by the University of Madras to avail the same.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh then enquired about the number of the faculty in the departments proposing the research courses and asked whether they have enough time on their hands in addition to their existing academic and quasi-academic work. He also suggested the reduction in the workload of the faculty who are to undertake teaching the M.Phil courses and thus promoting the willingness and ability to do research activity. He also suggested the strengthening of research base through small research projects before proceeding with an M.Phil course. The Chairperson announced that she would take up this suggestion for action.
- Mr. T.A. Varghese stated the growing need among TCS employees to upgrade their knowledge to M.Sc IT level. He enquired if the College could collaborate with TCS as TCS currently collaborates with Shastra University to provide these classes during the evening times for TCS employees and other working people. The Chairperson replied that the suggested measure would fall under a Shift III purview as per working hours and is currently not allowed by University but could be implemented once the College gained autonomy.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh suggested the merging of resources from the Business and Mathematics departments for the effective running of BSc Statistics department. Chairperson said that she would take it up for consideration.

After discussion the proposals for new courses for the academic year 2015 - 2016 was accepted and recommended by the Academic Council to the Governing Body.

## Agenda 4 – Admission Policy

Ms. B. Meena, Dean of Students presented the agenda on the admission policy. It covered various strategies adopted in the current academic year to increase enrollment, Challenges and strategies proposed to increase the enrollment of girl students

- Dr. LS Ganesh suggested the comparison of the College with neighbouring girls' college and the reason for preferring those colleges over Patrician. He also suggested Media Studies and Journalism as viable courses for women candidates. The Chairperson said that his suggestions would be taken up for consideration and action.
- Mr. T.A. Varghese suggested the projection of placement in a vital way to be a pull factor for potential candidates, especially the first generation learners.
- Prof. Dr. L.S. Ganesh suggested a projection of star placements and enquired about the strength of the alumni network, suggesting that it could be used as a sourcing structure for placements and also an advertising channel for the college. He also suggested timely placement newsbytes through social networking like Facebook and primarily Whatsapp.
- Fr. Xavier Arulraj stated that reservation policy as per government norms are not necessary for minority institutions and that the College could provide more than the number of reserved seats for the underprivileged.
- Mr. T.A. Varghese also stated that 60% of the BSc candidates hired for IT Infrastructure services at TCS are women candidates.
- The Chairperson addressed the issue of placement projection saying that the college has a Placement Cell which prepares an annual e-placement brochure and sends it out to all networks. The alumni of the college are very young and are still on the way up to influential positions but have contributed a lot as recruiters in the past campus recruitments. As for the reservation policy, the College goes above the reservation quota in most cases and that the quota stated is just to enforce the minimum level of reservation.

#### Agenda 5 – Research, Consultancy & Linkages

Dr. Nagajothi, IQAC Coordinator presented the agenda on Research, Consultancy and Linkages highlighting the research initiatives taken by the college, the consultancy policy outline and the level of linkages maintained with other organizations and associations. It was then left open to the floor for discussion.

• On the topic of Research, Dr. L.S. Ganesh suggested providing relive in workload through peer learning in order to make time free to engage in research. The Chairperson then addressed this issue highlighting the challenges of maintaining a learning atmosphere among the UG students in the absence of the teacher. She also stated that the tolerance level amongst

peers is quite low resulting in conflict, both verbal and physical in a few cases. Dr. L.S. Ganesh then suggested to carefully experiment peer learning with a focus group and then move out to the general student body constantly bringing the focus of such exercise to student friendly and academically enhancing objectives. This way time can be allotted for faculty to engage in research.

- With regard to the linkages and consultancy section, Mr. T.A. Varghese reiterated his offer for industrial visit to TCS and faculty development programme. He also said that placement is a very good highlighting feature for promoting linkages with corporate bodies. He emphasized on pushing placement incidents as success stories through Whatsapp alumni groups and suggested also to contact the parents of alumni who are also job providers. These parents would act as advocates to other parents of potential students to increase enrollment in the college. They would also act as sources of placements for the final year students as they stand as testimonials to the excellence of the College's academic capabilities in the success of their wards.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh also stressed on giving more importance to highlighting star alumni success stories from the past who can be an inspiration to the current students. The Chair person replied that many departments have, in the current semester, called their alumni as guests and judges to department competitions and other events.

#### Agenda 6 – Scholarships and Endowments

Ms. Lenora Vieyra, Governing Body Member presented the agenda on scholarship by highlighting the scholarship schemes made available through government bodies and private organizations. The topic of scholarships was then made open for discussion

- Mr. T.A. Varghese enquired on the fee amount being collected. The Chairperson gave details of the fee structure and that it was comparatively reasonable to other self financing institutions.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh enquired whether excellence in one semester has benefits in the next year, with special reference to relaxation in fees. This he said it could be a very strong motivation for the students to do well in their academics.
- The Chairperson then said that an initiative could be taken up by the departments to institute at least 2 or 3 scholarships through alumni or influential parents, citing the issue of a large number of students not able to pay the fees. Ms. Meena, the Dean of Students informed that alumni provided tie ups through MSME courses.

## Agenda 7 - Enhancement of Sports, Extra Curricular and Extension Activities

Dr. ArokiamaryGeetha Doss, the Vice Principal presented the agenda on the enhancement of sports, extracurricular activities and extension activities. The presentation was taken for discussion.

- Dr.Mahadevan suggested that inter zonal and zonal competitions, coaching campus, Team selection of University of Madras can be conducted at Patrician College. He also extended to support the sports personnel with special coaching camps. He also requested us to invite outstanding sports personalities from rural background to address the students specialized in sports in order to motivate and improve health oriented activities. He also assured to provide coaches on payment for specific games on regular basis.
- Mr. T.A. Varghese suggested that tie ups with other universities which provide sports scholarships for Master degree courses could be initiated. This way excellence through sports would also lead to avenues for higher study at subsidized rates.
- Dr. L.S. Ganesh suggested the setting of goals for short terms by ways of developing national team players for various sports from within the college. Dr. ArokiamaryGeetha Doss informed that the college has a national team player for Kabaddi Simeon of III BCom. This was appreciated by Dr. L.S. Ganesh.

## Agenda 8 – Proposal for Autonomy

Dr. Fatima Vasanth, Principal presented the proposal for Autonomy. Highlighting all the criteria required for an institution to be eligible for autonomy and how Patrician College fulfills all the criteria. It was then taken up for discussion.

• The Proposal for Autonomy was unanimously encouraged and the experts wished the management all the best in taking the institution forward towards autonomy.

The meeting came to an end with Vote of Thanks was proposed by Dr. Gnanapushpam, Center Head, PCEC.

- 5. **Smart Class Rooms**: The conference room in every block can be upgraded with ICT facility, dais, podium and conference chairs for holding departmental conferences and seminars.
- 6. **Green Boards:** To replace all black boards with green boards.
- 7. **Class Rooms:** With the expansion of academic programmes more classrooms space is required. The C Block can be demolished and newly constructed to accommodate more classrooms.
- **8.** Canteen: As the number of students has increased, canteen space and facilities should be enhanced. Renovations can be carried out to provide for more seating facilities.

### **MAJOR POLICIES:**

### I. Leave Policy and Procedure

### 1. Causal Leave

- Faculty who has completed one year can avail 12 days CL in a year.
- CL cannot be availed for more than 3 consecutive days.
- For the faculty on Probation leave will be granted on loss of pay (LOP).
- CL is not a matter of right.

Prior permission for CL should be obtained from Director between 11.15 a.m. -11.45 a.m. and submitted to the office. Principal and HOD should be informed of the same. Only on emergency the faculty should take permission over phone from the Director between 8 a.m. -8.30 a.m. and leave letter should be submitted the next working day. No SMS is permitted.

### Permission

• One permission can be availed per month (8.20 a.m.–9.20 a.m./1p.m.to 2 p.m.) Half Day leave can be availed Morning Session – 8.30 a.m. – 11.30 a.m. / Afternoon Session 11am – 2 p.m. To obtain Permission faculty should approach the Principal only between 11.15 a.m.–11.45 a.m. / 1.30-2pm.

### 2. Late

- Faculty reporting after 8.20 a.m. till 8.30 a.m. will be marked late. 3 late will be considered as 1/2CL or LOP.
- Over and above 3 days late will be carried over to the next month.

# 3. On Duty

- 2 days OD is permitted in a Semester per faculty.
- Examination duty will be at the discretion of the Principal.

Faculty members should obtain prior permission from Principal before giving consent for any programmes/examination duty outside college. Letter for OD should be submitted to the Principal along with invitation letter from the organization. Register will be maintained on OD and the concerned faculty should submit attendance certificate and a brief report about the OD.

### 4. Maternity Leave

• Faculty members who have completed one year will be eligible for Maternity Leave for 3 months/ 90 days.

### 5. Loss of Pay

• Absence during college events will be considered as LOP except absence on emergency grounds.

### **II. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM**

A grievance mechanism is created to encourage students to express individual and group concerns related to academic and non-academic concerns. The grievance mechanism has in place a Grievance Box (Yellow colour), a Suggestions Box (Green colour) and a Complaint Box for Sexual Harassment and Anti Ragging Complaint Box (Black colour) placed near the Principal's office. Wide publicity is given to the students to drop their grievance letters into the respective box. This will facilitate the firsthand information on grievances.

### **III.MENTORING POLICY**

Mentoring programme of Patrician College is introduced. The mentor / mentees meeting will take place every month. This will provide an opportunity to all faculty members (Mentors) to share their knowledge, counsel and advice new students (Mentees). Mentoring programme is an interactive mechanism which not only enhances the skills of Mentees but also the professional skills of Mentors of Patrician College.

### PATRICIAN COLLEGE EMPOWERMENT CELL (PCEC):

The objective is to facilitate need based skilled courses among students enabling them to acquire extra skills needed for the job market. Former Principal Dr.J.Gnanapushpam is appointed as Centre Head of PCEC. The PCEC was inaugurated on 1<sup>st</sup> August, on the College Anniversary Day, by Dr. Muthiah Mariappan, Former Vice Chancellor, Bharathidasan University.

- Communication Skills: The First course on communication skills was started on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014. This course is specifically designed for students who want to improve their communication skills and for students who are aspiring for higher studies. It is 30 hours course. 30 students completed the course.
- SPSS (Statistical Package for Social Sciences): This course is designed for students doing their project work and minor research work. This course was started on 6<sup>th</sup> September 2014. 26 students completed the course.

The PCEC proposes to offer many more need based certificate courses.
