
WORKSHOP ON CAREER GUIDANCE

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAM:

- To give career guidance for the students.
- To analyze and develop the professional skills of the students.
- To shape the personal behaviors and attitude of the students.

Sequences of the Workshop session :

Introduction:

Mr.Hariharan began this workshop session of career guidance at 8:45am with a small introduction about himself, about his graduation, his present position and the past and present work and activities done by him.

The Ice-breaker Session:

In order to break the ice and to build a rapport an ice-breaker activity has been performed to bridge the gap between him and the students. In this activity 10 to 15 random volunteers were called to perform the activity. In a straight line of alternative boys and girls were instructed to stand in front and to close their eyes. The initial person of the straight line formed has to visualize an action performed by Mr.Hariharan and was asked to pass on the same action to the next person one after the other. The final action which has been performed by the last person was end of the activity. This activity indicates that how important is communication and the way each person receives an instruction and how it has been carried out .

After the Ice-breaker session Mr.Hariharan asked about each ones personal skills and to analze it and to develop it.

He asked about the recent activities done by the students based on community organization and gave instructions in developing the skills of the students.

He spoke about the importance of the course and made the students to realize how privilege it is to study this course. He also spoke about his overcoming techniques of obstacles during his graduation. He instructed the students to write down their ambition in a sheet of paper and also to develop their skills since this is the right age for the students to develop their potential skills to the fullest and to make the maximum development of it and to gain lots of knowledge and never loose opportunities to gain experience.

A PPT was been put up for the students about the life history of jeffbezos the CEO of Amazon and also about Jack Ma who are among the richest people of the world and their way of developing their skills and tackling of obstacles in their successful career life. Another example of the experiment of a pike fish syndrome by a scientist which insisted that not to give up at any circumstances of life. Another example of honey bee was given to look at the problems in a easy a way of tackling them and to move forward.

An activity was performed by five random volunteers of the class which is similar to a game like activity based on listening, receiving and reacting to the command of the instructor.

This activity is to analyze that each person is specific in his/her thoughts and action and the way each person receives the message.

He also spoke about the CSR projects which could be done by an HR and also about the community development activities. He mainly insisted that the work done by any person should be liked by them and to put in the fullest effort in doing any activity which gives a proper satisfaction.

He spoke about the skills of leadership which each person should possess since he inculcated the saying that "As is the leader, so is the follower ". Therefore having a good personality as well as a good behavior and attitude is essential to possess a good leadership quality. He also insisted that the mind and body of a person should be linked before speaking and doing any sort of activity and the shaping of the behavior and activity has to be implemented right from now at this prime age of students which has to be cultivated and to develop to the fullest.

He spoke about the importance of communication with the people and the proper usage of language skills which has to be developed by every individual in order to have a proper communication with people and to build confidence. He shared techniques on how to improve communication skills which includes speaking in front of the mirror for at least 2 minutes a day to build up personal confidence while communicating with others.

Another activity which was based on sleeping in which the students were asked to try sleeping for 5 to 10 minutes in order to have relaxation as well as to know the importance of sleeping.

A video was played about the importance and the facts of having a proper sleep. The video included the dreams of children, adolescence and the adults and also the causes of insufficient sleep and the effects of it. It also includes the method of proper sleeping .another video of motivation of believing and not to give up till the last moment and keep trying towards the achievement to the fullest was also played.

He spoke about the preparation of resume for any interviews and also about the privilege of the course and as well as the weightage of it.

Another activity which is based on the unity was performed in which five students were instructed to stand in a two sheets of paper for a particular time. This activity is purely to strengthen the unity of the team members and to analyze that each person is unique. This is to develop the team work, co-ordination and the co-operation of each individuals together.

There was a short break between 11:00am to 11:25am.

After the break a group discussion was held based on the topic of Artificial Intelligence whether it is a boon or a curse to the world. Each one shared their particular views on it.

At 12:00pm the session was concluded by Mr.Hariharan saying that opportunities are wide open in the hands of everyone and to make the fullest use of it and he mainly insisted

the students to have a proper and a well mannered attitude and behavior since attitude is the everything which completes a person.

PROGRAM OUTCOME:

The students were benefited through the program which gave them an idea to pursue their career after the graduation and to inculcate a better and proper attitude and behavior and to develop their skills to the fullest for achieving the goal.

FEEDBACK:

Since improper communication prevails to be the block for interacting with the people and the society, his teachings of basic techniques removes the block and creates confidence among the individuals if it is made into a regular practice.

Though the age of adolescence does not realize the importance of sleep and its benefits, the method which was delivered to the students by him about the awareness of sleeping was insisted in a very deeper way in the minds of the students.

Since due lack of time and equipments a few required activities could not be conducted and performed

TRAINING ON LIFE SKILLS

Introduction

Adolescence, a vital stage of growth and development, marks the period of transition from childhood to adulthood. It is characterized by rapid physiological changes and psychosocial maturation. Adolescence is also the stage when young people extend their relationships beyond parents and family and are intensely influenced by their peers and the outside world in general. As adolescents mature cognitively, their mental process becomes more analytical. They are now capable of abstract thinking, better articulation and of developing an independent ideology. These are truly the years of creativity, idealism, buoyancy and a spirit of adventure. But these are also the years of experimentation and risk-taking, of giving in to negative peer pressure, of taking uninformed decisions on crucial issues, especially relating to their bodies and their sexuality. Adolescence is thus a turning point in one's life, a period of increased potential but also one of greater vulnerability.



Need for the training

Life skill training is very important for everyone who would like to be most successful in career and look for a quality personal life. Ideally if these skills are given from school age, the effect will be seen when the individual is ready to take decisions related to their choice of career and accordingly the selection of courses, be it professional or otherwise. Hence this training was conducted for the social work students

Report on Two Days National Workshop On

"Cyber Security and Ethical Hacking"

Organised by Department of Computer Applications, Department of Computer Science & BEC on IIT Delhi

(17th to 18th July 2018)

The workshop of "**Cyber Security and Ethical Hacking**" was organised by Department of Computer Applications and Department of Computer Science, during 17th and 18th July 2018. There were total 45 participants. Among 45 participants; 10 out-side institutional students and 35 institutional students were registered.

During these two days, various industry experts shared their insights, real life scenarios, practical cases and their experiments on Ethical Hacking domain.

Day – 1

The first lecture session of the workshop was delivered by Mr. Varun Pathak, Senior Security Analyst, PwC, Gurgaon, India. He started with a keynote lecture about the basics of Ethical Hacking. He explained the various types of hackers and covered the necessity of hats and security hackers. In the second phase of session, the core part of Hacking and case studies were covered. It includes the real time practice of Injections which mainly includes SQL Injection, Server Side Injection, Command Injection and HTML Injection in detail. To illustrate the topic of broken authentication and session management, he explained the practical aspects of insecure login forms, password attacks, session management and session management on administrator portals. He had

also covered the cross site scripting concept to know about XSS to send a malicious script to an unsuspecting user. He was delivered the details about the types of XSS with practical approaches. The session was followed by vulnerability assessment and software penetration testing.

Day – 2

The Second day sessions was handled by Mr. Mr. Varun Pathak, Senior Security Analyst, PwC, Gurgaon, India. He started the first session of second day with the discussion of insecure direct object reference which mainly focused on manipulation and unauthorised access of data. The main focus of this session was security misconfiguration which includes the application frameworks, application server, web server, database server and platform secure setting configuration. The implementation and maintenance was also covered. According to him many web applications do not protect the sensitive data so attacker can easily modify protected data .Hence he had taught how to take the extra protection of sensitive data as well as how to take special precautions while exchanging the data with browser.5 participants were selected for II Round which will be conducted by Delhi IIT.





COUNSELLORS TRAINING PROGRAM

Career Counselling is a basic factor for distinguishing the genuine potential and required skills graduating students towards a correct profession way. Our students need to know the significance of profession training and right direction before they will pick a place in the field of psychology in addition to the wake of taking the board tests. Such programs will be useful picking a lifelong objective, arranging and provide a guidance to students for a superior future ahead. As an initiative for career orientation of the undergraduate students of psychology, a six day workshop titled counsellors training program was conducted in association with, Sadhbava counselling and training services, Chennai, during 3 - 8 September, 2018. Ms. Hemamalini Lakshminarasimhan facilitated the workshop as the resource person. 30 undergraduate students participated of which 10 students belonged to colleges other than host.

Ms. Hemamalini, started the Day 1 of the workshop with ice breakers and gathered the inputs as expectations of workshop. Fun tasks were assigned to upgrade collaboration among members and they were gotten some information about Counselling aptitudes. The fallacies of counselling and guidance were featured and comprehended. Day 2 exchanges prompted the comprehension of do's and don'ts in counselling though Day 3 tended to the essential phases of counselling alongside issues identified with professinal practice. Participants appreciated the learning of SOLER method at Day 4 and the preparation program finished at Day 6 with introduction towards different territories of Counselling. From the participants' view, the training program was very much helpful and it opened new avenues for undergraduate students of psychology in their career building.

COGNITIVE BEHAVIOUR THERAPY (CBT) - WORKSHOP

Department of Psychology offered a two-day workshop on 19th and 20th September of 2018. The resource person who facilitated was Mr. S. Krishnan, Founder - Well Being Center (A counsellor, psychotherapist, trainer and a member of Chennai Counselling Services). 
